- 2) The box contained **gold** coins.

stole: past of steal Example sentences:

- 1) She **stole** a lot money from the bag.
- 2) The man **stole** the car from the parking.

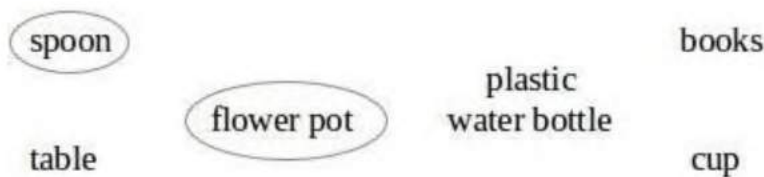
